- **Urban design and the knowledge economy into co-operation** (Yigitcanlar & Inkinen 2019)



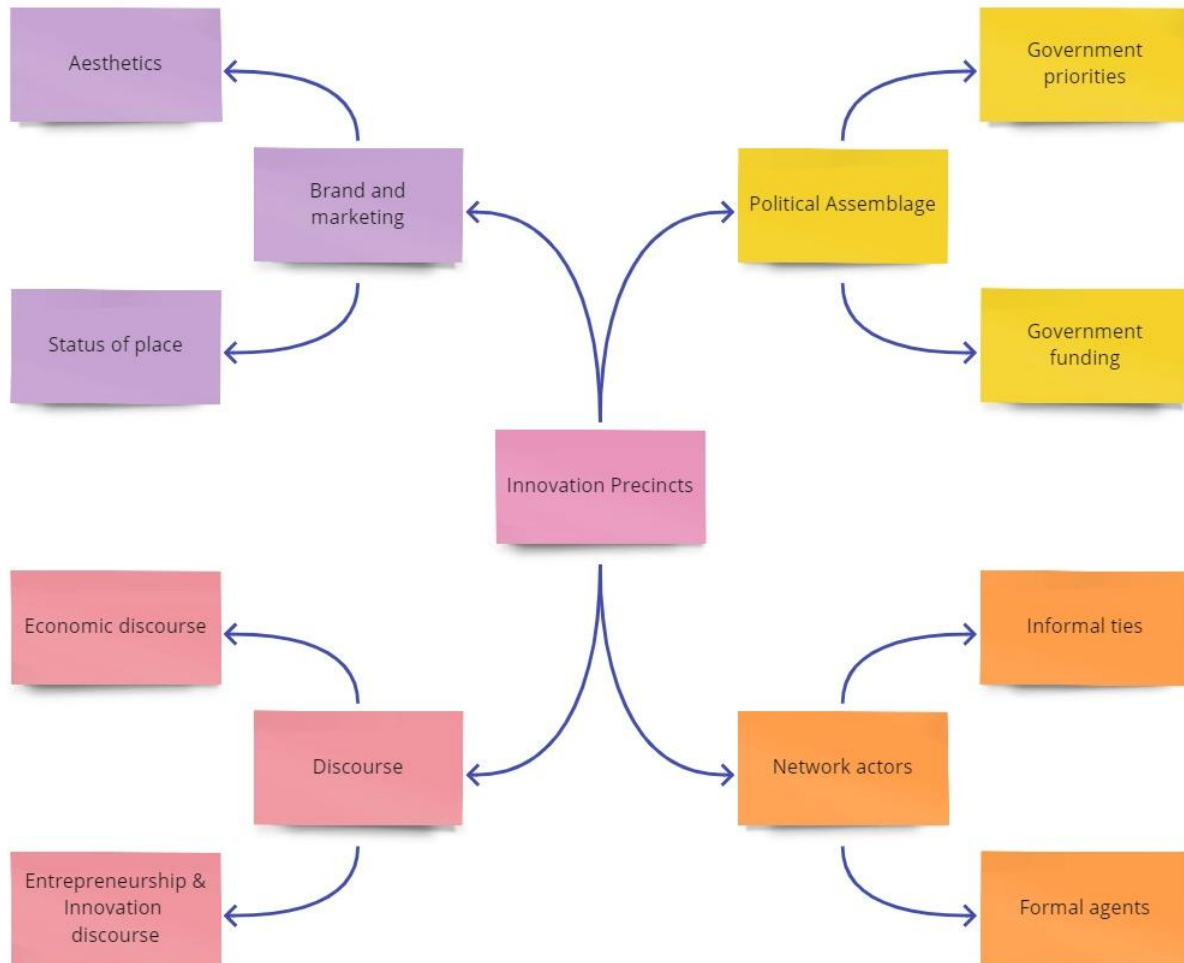

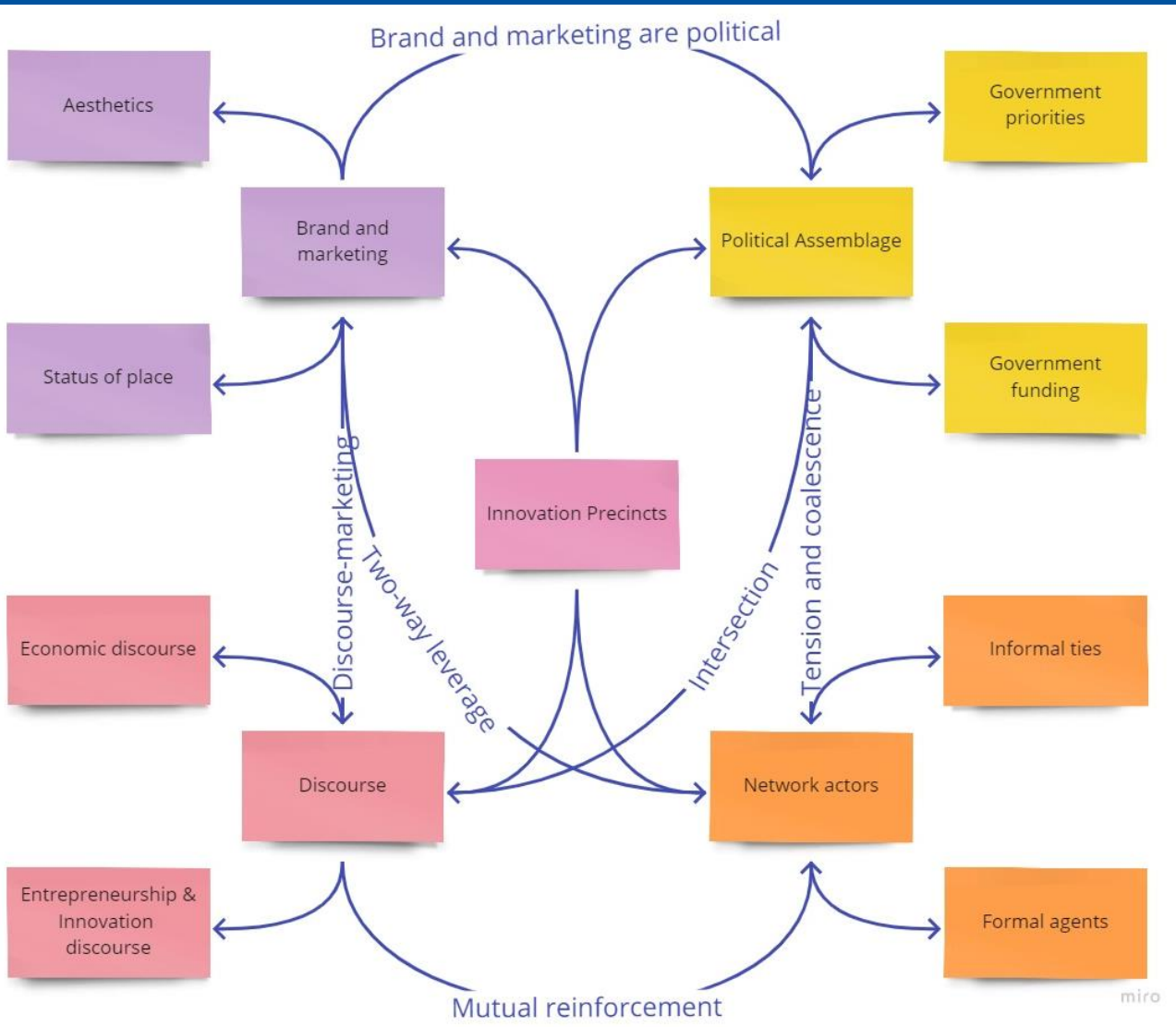

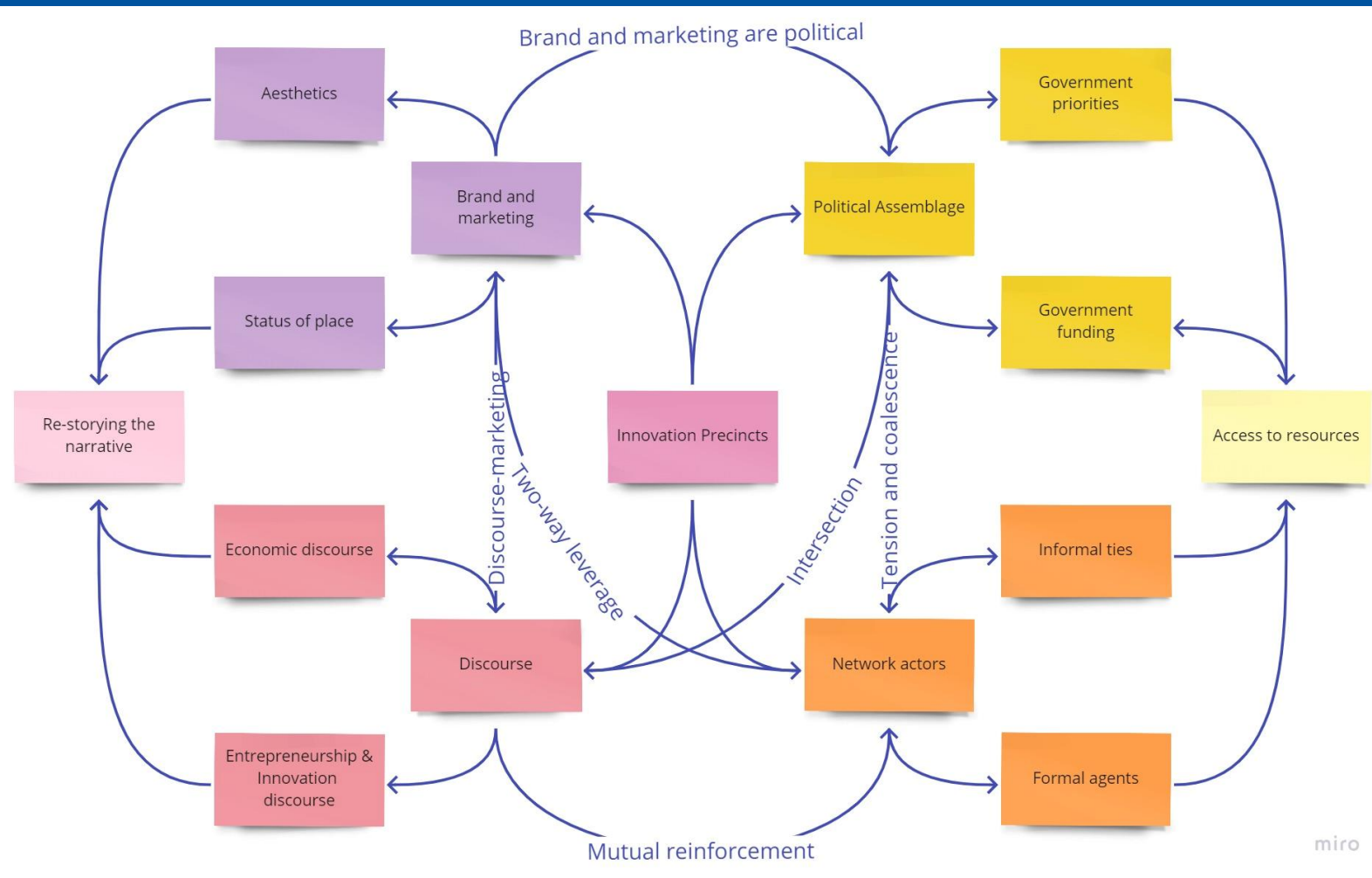
Intersectionality
